QUESTION 26 (3 marks)

Gemma is 10 years old and used to love spending time with cats. Explain why the two explanations of Frank's behaviour are different.

QUESTION 31 (3 marks)

Contrast explicit and implicit racism, using an example of each.

QUESTION 32 (3 marks)

Explain social and cognitive origins of attraction in terms of proximity, reciprocity and similarity.

QUESTION 33 (1 mark)

Zoe was packing her bag for school one day. As she was zipping up her bag, her mother came into her room dressed in exercise clothes, ready to go to the gym. When Zoe saw her mother, she recalled that she had Physical Education that day and needed to pack her sports uniform.

With reference to retrieval failure theory, describe how Zoe remembered that she had Physical Education.

QUESTION 34 (2 marks)

Identify the types of learning that occur between an 18-year-old student and their parents, and the student and their friend. Propose which type of learning is more effective at developing behaviours.


