Background Information

The 2016 Young Australians of the Year are Lucas Patchett and Nic Marchesi from Queensland. Nic and Lucas founded Orange Sky Laundry, a free mobile laundry service for the homeless. They were presented with their award by the Prime Minister of Australia at a ceremony in Sydney on 26 January 2016, in the presence of a live audience and the seven other finalists. - 29 across ^six services in Australia,
- 30 we realize it is so (.) much (.) more.
- 31 (...)We've (.) we can ^restore respect,

- 33 and be a ^catalyst for conversation.

- 35 how ^they want to be treated.
