#### TEXT 1

#### **Background Information**

Text 1 is a media release that was published by the Coalition Government on its website on May 19, 2016 prior to the Australian Federal election held on July 2, 2016.

- 1. A re-elected Turnbull Government will strengthen existing workplace laws to ensure better
- 2. protections for workers and to stamp out exploitation by unscrupulous employers.
- 3. The Coalition's focus on jobs and growth will be complemented by increased safeguards for
- 4. vulnerable workers who have been let down in recent times as a result of blatant non-compliance
- 5. with workplace laws by employers across a number of industries and in many cases, multinational
- 6. corporations who ignore their obligations under Australian laws.
- 7. Today the Turnbull Government announces that, if re-elected, stronger protections for vulnerable
- 8. workers will be delivered by:
- 9. increasing the penalties that apply to employers who underpay workers and who fail to keep
- 10. proper employment records. A new higher penalty category of 'serious contraventions' will be
- 11. introduced, and will apply to any employer that has intentionally ripped off workers, regardless
- 12. of the employer's size
- 13. introducing new offence provisions that capture franchisors and parent companies who fail to
- 14. deal with exploitation by their franchisees
- delivering a \$20 million funding increase for the capabilities and workforce of the Fair Work
   Ombudsman
- 17. strengthening the powers of the Fair Work Ombudsman so that it can more effectively deal with
  18. employers who intentionally exploit workers by compelling them to produce information and
  19. answer questions
- 20. establishing a Migrant Workers Taskforce in the Fair Work Ombudsman that will target
- 21. employers who exploit migrant workers
- 22. The Coalition will provide stronger and more effective laws to help prevent a recurrence of the
- 23. shocking stories of exploitation that we have witnessed in recent times.
- 24. The widespread non-compliance within the 7-Eleven chain is perhaps the most well-known example,
- 25. however unfortunately it is by no means the only one.
- 26. Given 7-Eleven's failings to address the significant breaches of workplace laws, Prof Allan Fels AO
- 27. and Dr David Cousins will be engaged to work with the Fair Work Ombudsman's Migrant Workers
- 28. Taskforce. The Taskforce, with advice from Professor Fels and Dr Cousins, will provide oversight and

- 29. advice to the Fair Work Ombudsman to ensure that 7-Eleven rectifies the serious breaches
- 30. committed by its franchise network and to ensure 7-Eleven takes responsibility for addressing its
- 31. systematic failing to provide minimum entitlements to 7-Eleven franchise employees.
- 32. The Coalition's management of this issue has been strong and methodical, unlike that of Labor. Bill
- 33. Shorten's policy on the run approach has led to a deeply-flawed policy that exempts small
- 34. businesses from any higher penalties. This would mean that 7-Eleven franchisees will not be
- 35. covered by Labor's policy.
- 36. The existing Fair Work laws established by Labor have failed to prevent worker exploitation scandals such as 7-Eleven. Labor's proposed policy would not address such scandals.
- 37. The Coalition's commitment will protect vulnerable workers and help ensure better workplaces in
- 38. Australia. A re-elected Turnbull Government will deliver jobs, growth and strong workplace
- 39. protections for all workers
